Students with Chronic Health Conditions

Chronic health conditions are described as physical, developmental, behavioral or emotional conditions that last for a prolonged time period, require more than routine health services and can cause or contribute to chronic and sometimes extended absences. These students may have rights under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504) to receive specialized or general instruction, health and other related services, and accommodations that help them remain in school and not be retained in grade.

Students with and without chronic health conditions are protected by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). The District is required to protect any sensitive personally identifiable information from unconsented disclosure, except in certain circumstances
