Bullying Awareness and PreventionQuick Reference Guide

CMCSS Definition of Bullying

Bullying occurs when all of the following occur:

- harm occurs through an intentional act; AND
- a power imbalance exists; AND
- the accused enjoys carrying out the action; <u>AND</u>
- the accused repeats the behavior, often in a systematic way; AND
- the target has a sense of being persecuted or oppressed and is hurt physically and/or psychologically

Types of Bullying

- Physical pushing, kicking, hitting, spitting
- **Emotional** name calling, damage to property
- Relational exclusion, picked last for team
- Cyber Bullying bullying through media (texts, social media websites, chat rooms, etc.

High Risk Groups for Being Bullied

- Children with disabilities, special needs, and health problems
- Children who are obese
- Children who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or who are questioning their identities

Effects of Bullying on the Target

- Depression
- Increased illnesses
- Truancy
- · Lower academic achievement
- Decreased class participation
- Difficulty concentrating
- Changes in sleep and eating patterns
- Begin a level of extreme retaliation measures
 - Outbursts
 - Fights
 - Brings weapon to school



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Warning Signs

- Torn, damaged, or missing belongings
- Unexplained cuts, bruises, or scratches
- Few or no friends
- Fearful to go to school, to walk to and from school, to ride the school bus, or take part in clubs/organized activities
- Low self-esteem
- Loss of interest in school; begins to perform poorly
- Sad, moody, teary, depressed
- Headaches, stomachaches, other physical ailments
- Difficulty sleeping, frequent bad dreams
- Loss of appetite

How to Intervene

- 1. Stop the bullying
- 2. Support student who has been bullied
- 3. Name bullying behavior and refer to school rules
- 4. Engage the bystanders
- 5. Impose immediate and appropriate consequences
- 6. Take steps to ensure bullied student will be protected from future bullying

CMCSS Reporting Procedure

According to CMCSS Policy <u>INS-A016</u>:

- School/district personnel <u>MUST</u> report alleged incidents of bullying
- Students are **EXPECTED** to report
- Parents and other stakeholders are <u>ENCOURAGED</u> to report
- All school staff must be trained on reporting procedures

All school personnel who witness or receive a report of bullying-related acts:

- Complete Incident Reporting Form INS-F111 www.cmcss.net/iso/masterdocs/INS-F111.pdf
- Submit to an administrator as soon as possible but **no later than the end of the next** school day



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Discrimination

Discrimination can occur in different ways: Disparate treatment, harassment, and failure to accommodate

- Disparate treatment involves the treatment of a student that is less favorable that the treatment of others in similar situations for a discriminatory purpose, i.e., protected class status.
- Harassment involves unwelcome conduct (physical, verbal, or written) that is so severe, persistent, or objectively offensive that it is sufficiently serious to interfere with, limit, or deprive access to a student's ability to participate in or benefit from the educational opportunities provided by the district to students. It could also involve the submission to, or rejection of, the conduct by a student if used as a factor or the student is led to believe it will be a factor in decision(s) affecting the student's education.
- Failure to accommodate (if a disability condition exists for student).

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
