APPEAL PROCEDURES REMANDMENT AND EXPULSION

If your child has been suspended/expelled for more than ten (10) school days, you have a right to appeal this decision. All appeals must be filed, orally or in writing, within five (5) days of your receipt of this notice, and may be filed by a parent or guardian, the student, or any person holding a teaching license who is employed by the School System who agrees to file the request upon behalf of the student. Appeals should be directed to the Director of Student Services at the Greenwood Complex, 430 Greenwood Avenue, Clarksville, TN 37040. The Director of Student Services may be reached by telephone at (931) 542-5065. A hearing will be set on the matter no later than ten (10) school days after the beginning of the suspension and you will be given written notice of the time and place of the hearing. Please refer to the <u>Student Code of Conduct</u> (Rights, Responsibilities, Rules, and Due Process Procedures) distributed to your child at the beginning of the school year for more information concerning the appeal process.

RE-ADMISSION Prior to your child being re-admitted to school at the expiration of the suspension/remandment/expulsion, the following conditions must be met: A meeting with you is required prior to re-admitting your child. The meeting is scheduled at the school office at on ______. If you have a serious problem which would prevent your meeting at that time, please contact the school office immediately to re-schedule. If this box is not checked, a meeting is not required; however, if you desire a meeting, you may request one by contacting the school office. If this suspension is for more than five (5) days, a plan will be developed for improving your child's behavior and that plan will become effective upon your child's re-admission to school. Your child will be provided a copy of that plan upon re-admission and you should review that plan to ensure that you understand it and will cooperate in its implementation. Your child's failure to follow that plan will result in further disciplinary action. Conditions (if applicable): During the period of suspension or assignment to the Alternative School, the student may not be on the campus of any Clarksville Montgomery County School and may not participate in any school-sponsored activities. When a student is suspended/remanded, it will be the student's responsibility to see the teacher about any missed work, nine weeks tests, unit tests, or semester examinations upon the day of the student's return to school. When a student is suspended, the student will have the opportunity to receive credit for any work missed, if the student makes arrangements with his/her teachers to do so. These tests may be completed at the convenience of the teacher within an equal number of days commensurate with the number of consecutive days of the suspension. In the event the suspension occurred during the last ten (10) days of any term or semester, your child will be permitted to take such final examinations as are necessary to complete the course of instruction for that semester.
